FreeDV - Digital Voice on HF

Have you heard of Digital Voice on the HF ham bands? If you listen around 14.236 MHz on Sunday afternoons, you probably have heard it and not known what that noise was. The signals are narrower than SSB and reproduce voice without any background noise, like your 2-meter FM rig. Mel Whitten, KØPFX is one of the developers of this new mode. He is one of the top digital guys in the country. Mel lives in the St. Louis area and is a good friend. He was the guy that got me going with Packet radio way back, then on to PSK-31 many years later but still long before soundcard modes were popular. Mel likes to stay on the cutting edge of technology and keeps his ham shack equipped with the best. I like it when Mel buys a new rig...cuz I get a chance to buy his old stuff and his old stuff is nice.

Getting back to digital voice, the software is free. Just download it form http://freedv.org/tiki-index.php. The software uses your computer's soundcard to code and decode the zeros and ones into voice and back. The software runs on Windows, Mac OS, Linux and more operating systems. The web site has some demos that you can watch to learn about how to setup your system. One of the instructions say that you need 2 soundcards to make it work. I only have one and use a USB headset for the 2nd one. Your computer's soundcard talks to your radio and your USB headset talks to your computer. It's really pretty easy to setup. I sort of fumbled my way through the setup and put my rig in transmit and called TEST TEST and K5WH in Houston, TX came back to me. I was running 30 watts into my dipole antenna. Boy, was I surprised. As easy as this mode is to setup and the fact that it's free makes the transition to digital simple. Most of us have modes like PSK-31 setup on our radios. Just add a USB headset to that, and you're ready to launch to the next new frontier.

I don't think there will be the fight like the transition from AM to SSB. You don't need to buy a new radio to make it work. A great feature with FreeDV is the fact there is no QRM from adjacent frequencies and it doesn't take up as much bandwidth as SSB. The heart of making digital voice work is the audio codec (code/decode). The original attempt for digital voice used a commercially produced codec. It worked well, but the developers threatened to sue for infringement on their patent rights. Fortunately, there was a ham way down under in Australia, David Rowe, who wrote an audio codec he named Codec2 as part of his research while working on he PHD degree. The guys here in the states convinced him to do a little more development on it and make it available for free ham use.

I had the pleasure of being introduced to this new voice mode when we were out on the west coast last October at the Pacificon Hamfest. One of Mel's friends and joint developer Bruce Perens put on the forum to a packed house. Mel also had a setup at his booth there too. He was using his Flex 5000A software connected remotely to Gerry, N4DV's Flex 5000A station in Florida. We were actually transmitting from Florida sort of like what I do with my remote hookup when we are traveling. I was talking via digital voice at the hamfest to another ham in Tennessee without any noise. The hamfest was noisy but no background noise came thru. The only difficult part was on my end hearing thru the noisy crowd. That was my first live QSO using FreeDV. Later in October, Helen and I went to the ARRL Midwest Division Hamfest where Mel setup shop showing off FreeDV. He also put on a digital voice forum there too. Fast forwarding to Orlando in February, Mel did it again. This time with a little practice behind him, Mel put on a great forum. He told me afterwards that he is also doing a forum at Dayton and also at the ARRL's National Centennial Hamfest in Hartford, CT in July. The show is going big time.

There is another web site called "FreeDV QSO Finder, <u>http://qso.k7ve.org/</u>. You can login and put your frequency and see who else is on and what frequency they are tuned to. All the regular frequencies are listed there that cover all the popular ham bands. By rule, digital voice must be done on the phone bands. The main watering hole for FreeDV is 20-meters on 14.236 MHz. Give it a try. 73, Rick (WØPC)
