

What's Joe Been Up To: A couple of videos I uploaded to U-Tube, the files were too large to e-mail. One is my 63 Corvette 509 BBC running a quarter mile race at Ubly Dragway, losing in the semi finals on a "red light" foul; the other is a round robin win at Lapeer Dragway in my 92 Camaro 565 BBC running one-eighth mile drags. Note the difference in speed and E.T. between 1/4 and 1/8 mile; 152 MPH vs. 125 MPH. Wind resistance really takes a toll at over 100 MPH. Note: This is handicapped racing, so the slower car gets a head start and the faster car has to catch him at the finish line; the difference is calculated and is reflected

when the green light comes on on the "Christmas tree" in each lane. My cars were usually the fastest "door car" (version a "rail dragster") at the track so I had to chase down everyone! Enjoy.


