Web Based Remote Shortwave Receivers Assist Rx Capability on the GM HF Net

Greetings to all our GMARC Regular and Heritage Members. Our previous newsletter article, early October 2018, discussed how we can use available web based short wave software defined receivers (SDR) along with our own transmitter. These SDRs enable us to take advantage of receivers in favorable locations that can hear the stations we can't on our own. Two of these web based remote receive websites are:

WebSDR <u>http://websdr.org/ (complete listing worldwide)</u>; can limit search to North America

SDR.hu https://sdr.hu/ (complete listing worldwide) ; can limit search to North America or USA

Each web site lists a large number of remote Rx sites ; USA and around the world. <u>Providers of the Rx Re-</u><u>motes are generally Hams or SWLers.</u> Remember ... they're <u>FREE!</u>

Our previous article highlighted <u>the K3FEF remote Rx in Milford, PA – northeast Pennsylvania near New</u> Jersey and not far from New York City. This remote Rx has capacity for up to 50 simultaneous users. <u>http://k3fef.com:8901/</u>

The sdr.hu Rx remotes (e.g. Penn State Rx and W3PIE Rx) have a smaller capacity typically four (4) users.

Several of our GM HF Net regulars continue to use the K3FEF remote Rx with good results.

We've discovered two more Rx Remote SDRs also in Pennsylvania. These have given good and sometimes better Rx results. These are both located on the https://sdr.hu/ website. Specifically :

<u>The W3PIE Remote Rx</u> showed especially good results during October and November. These Remote Rx may give better, more copyable, reception at other times depending on band conditions. These three remote Rx in Pennsylvania are the best we've found thus far. As time goes on, we may discover more as more remotes come online. Operation of the Remote Rx is pretty straightforward but it does take a little practice to get comfortable with them and their features. You can practice anytime. They're on 24/7.

W8MRW uses a vintage Dell Latitude 830 laptop computer running Remote Hams software, with W0PC (or other) Remote operating in one window with a second window with one of the desired Remote Rx station. Hearing yourself transmitting on the Remote Rx can be confusing. W8MRW uses his headset volume control to minimize the Rx sound when Tx ; returning it to normal for receiving.

Remember to revisit our first Remote Rx article (early October 2018) ; especially if you have not tried these as yet. Remember also the several YouTube videos for WebSDR and SDR.hu showing their operation. Worth a look. Let us know if you've found any other Remote Rx which could benefit our GM HF Net participants.


